

HIGHWAYMAN TRAILBLAZER



HIGHWAYMAN CABERNET SAUVIGNON

The vineyards in the "Banana Belt" region of Sonoma Valley are know for producing big, rich powerfully elegant wines due to the warm climate and geothermal activity that warms the soil. Our Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon has all of the

trademarks of this area of Sonoma. Palate-coating flavors of dark chocolate, blackberry and blueberry are beautifully balanced with hints of toasted Vanilla and oak.



RESERVE & SITE SPECIFIC

Highwayman Wines are the Reserve Tier for Highway 12 Winery. Each lot harvested from the Serres Ranch in Sonoma Valley is kept separate from start to finish. The best of these finished lots are selected for the Highwayman Wines program. All of these wines reflect the distinct charateristics of the warmest region of Sonoma Valley called "The Banana Belt". This area has the optimum warm climate and warm soils (due to local geothermal activity) for the growth of Bordeaux and other red varietals.
